Since 2013, the New York Life Foundation has invested over \$68 million to help children build bright futures. The New York Life Foundation works with partners that help build academic foundations and foster social and emotional skills for middle schoolers during the critical out-of-school hours to prepare them for their transition to high school and beyond.

In 2021, the New York Life Foundation awarded a two-year, \$200,000 grant to The Actuarial Foundation. The grant supports the [Math Motivators Tutoring Program](#) and the [Hardest Math Problem Competition](#).

[Afterschool All-Stars](#)

In 2021, the New York Life Foundation awarded a two-year, \$1.6 million grant to Afterschool All-Stars. The grant enables Afterschool All-Stars to evolve its [programs](#) to meet current student needs amid COVID recovery, deepen community engagement and family outreach, and help Afterschool All-Stars invest in needed organizational infrastructure.

In 2019, the New York Life Foundation awarded a four-year, \$548,000 grant to the Afterschool Alliance. The grant supports Afterschool Alliance's work to administer the [New York Life Foundation's Aim High RFP program](#) for out-of-school time programs serving middle school youth.

In 2017, the New York Life Foundation awarded the American Museum of Natural History a five-year, \$5 million grant. New York Life Foundation's investment supports the construction of the Middle School Zone within [The Richard Gilder Center for Science, Education, and Innovation](#).

This grant allows Breakthrough Collaborative to expand and strengthen its year-round school [program](#) across its affiliates as well as increase its impact on students and their academic progress to ensure their readiness for high school and college.

In 2021, the New York Life Foundation awarded a two-year, \$1.5 million grant to Read to Lead. This grant supports Read to Lead in expanding its community of educators and youth served, creating the next generation of [Read to Lead experiences](#), and advancing its learning model by creating a Research and Innovation Lab.
