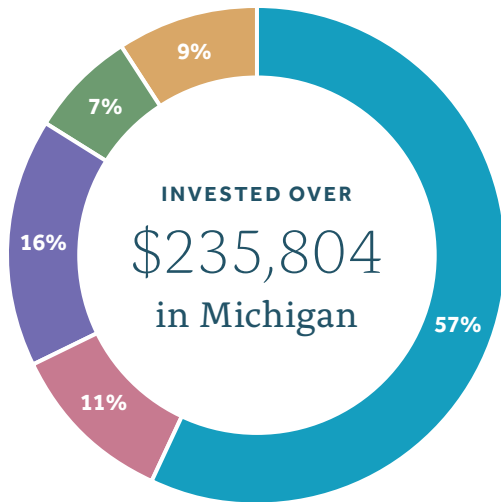

**GRIEF-SENSITIVE SCHOOLS INITIATIVE (GSSI) NEW**

In 2018, New York Life launched a groundbreaking national program called the Grief-Sensitive Schools Initiative (GSSI).
